Keys In Processing Prophetic Words: Principles, Processing, and Partnering

Principles for Discerning Prophetic Words: Use the prompts to discern your significant word

- Is the prophetic word (*private revelation*) consistent with Scripture & Tradition (Public Revelation)?
- Is it consistent with the character of God?
- Does it resonate with me and witness to my Spirit as from God?
- Can I trust the source?
- Does it glorify God and draw me closer to Christ?
- How do my family, close friends and spiritual counselors feel about this word?

“Love never fails. If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing. For we know partially and we prophesy partially.” -1 Corinthians 13:8-9

Processing your Prophetic Words: Use the following to annotate your significant word

- Identity words - circle them.
- Promises God is making to you - underline them.
- Conditions (what God wants you to do) - mark them.
- Timing or seasons - mark them.
- Metaphors or biblical references - mark them.
- Notice any recurring themes - mark them.

Partnering with Grace: Use the following to be empowered by your significant prophetic words

- Ask God what he’s saying to you from that word.
- Come into agreement with the word over your life.
- Meditate and study important aspects of the word.
- Appropriate your mindset, time and resources toward the direction of the word on your life.

CRAFTED PROPHETIC PRAYER
